


and enhance Africa's shared resources in the nine countries where we operate.

TNC's work in Africa transcends three key pillars: (i) securing ownership rights to lands and resources for indigenous people; (ii) strengthening leadership and resource management; and (iii) helping communities value nature through a holistic appreciation of its benefits while increasing revenue streams for conservation efforts and socio-economic development. Together with our partners, we are witnessing critical milestones in integrated land and fisheries management, ocean and source water protection, energy development and sustainable food production, working together and strengthening our resolve in tackling global challenges such as climate change, habitat and biodiversity loss that

stands to adversely impact the nearly 1.4 billion people that share Africa.

In Gabon, The Nature Conservancy is working collaboratively in support of the country's ambitious biodiversity conservation and climate mitigation agenda. TNC works across freshwater, ocean and terrestrial ecosystems to protect and sustainable manage critical habitats for species, ecosystems, and carbon stocks. TNC brings science and innovative tools and approaches to inform better decision-making, develops innovative financial mechanisms for long-term sustainability, cultivates strategic partnership and fosters the needs for inclusive, equitable conservation that benefits nature and people.





The Gabon PFP Director oversees all aspects of PFP development and is ultimately responsible to ensure the initiative reaches the single close. The Director works closely with the Gabon Country Director, the Gabon PFP Team, the Gabon PFP Steering Committee and the Africa leadership team to advance progress across all elements of the PFP to ensure that this initiative delivers strong outcomes during the implementation period for biodiversity, climate and people. They play a key role in establishing strong external relationships with relevant stakeholders, main project partners, and team members, ensuring a strong buy-in for project objectives. They liaise with the PFP Steering Committee for the purpose of developing and closing the Gabon PFP initiative, and liaise with government agencies, other conservation organizations, foundations,

communities and other stakeholders and rights holders. Reporting to the Gabon Country Director, the position will be based at the TNC office in Libreville – Gabon.

The PFP Director will oversee the Gabon PFP Team and all the major PFP workstreams to ensure steady progress is being made and to ensure that the final agreements are supported by the key stakeholders (government, external funders, civil society, indigenous peoples and local communities, and other stakeholders) and closing conditions are in place. The Director oversees the technical work as well as the negotiations on the final agreements that define the all-important PFP closing and disbursement conditions. Ultimately, the PFP Director is responsible for delivering a successful closing of the Gabon PFP

by 2023. They define roles and responsibilities, recruits, and leads the project team to successfully achieve identified goals in the most cost-effective and time-saving manner possible. The PFP Director obtains go/no-go decisions at key decision points, identifies, and obtains approval for project deliverables from the appropriate staff or teams. Throughout the project life cycle, they monitor and measure project progress, conducts corrective action as necessary, communicates project status to major stakeholders: TNC country, regional and global staff; Enduring Earth partners; and key partners in Gabon. The PFP Director is responsible for risk management, issue resolution, and conflict management, and collaboratively solves complex problems. They utilize project management methodologies and processes, and ensures all organizational standards are met.

### **DIMENSIONS OF THE ROLE:**

- Ensure the development of goals and detailed plans of the PFP in the following areas: conservation, climate mitigation, community development, finance, fundraising and conservation trust fund
- Develop closing and disbursement conditions for the PFP that are acceptable to all key parties to the PFP Agreements. Use judgement and experience to recommend when the closing conditions have in aggregate been satisfied and deal should move to closing or if additional modifications are needed. Help secure agreement on formal closing conditions for the PFP
- Lead transition activities during the start-up of the implementation stage following a successful closing
- Lead the master PFP workplan including setting realistic deadlines, managing timelines, and ensuring accountability and ensure supporting workplans are well executed and deadlines are met
- Prepare regular updates for the Gabon PFP Steering Committee and Enduring Earth Partnership on progress, obstacles, and achievements
- Ensure coordinated efforts across each work streams, provide advisory and guidance with regular updates to the Gabon Country Director
- Manage different work streams and multi-disciplinary expert/task teams; use project management tools to track work streams to ensure successful closing and set of outcomes
- Provide leadership to a range of stakeholder

- meetings and workshops in Gabon as needed to support the various work streams
- In coordination with the Fundraiser, oversees the preparation of proposals and fundraising materials (for public and private funding)
- Manage contracts with expert consultants, supervise work, and help ensure cross-team coordination and coordinated approaches with external partners
- Lead the preparation of briefing materials and other internal and external communications materials
- Act independently within broad program goals to prioritize tasks in the absence of specific instructions and exercise independent judgment to identify and solve problems
- Oversight for all financial and compliance responsibilities for the program
- Ensure compliance with Conservancy policies and procedures, and external requirements (decisions may bind the organization financially or legally)
- Establish and maintain optimal performance standards within budget, analyze gaps and develop mitigation plans
- Supervise other PFP project staff as assigned
- Negotiate complex agreements, in a political environment
- Work environment may involve exposure to disagreeable elements and minor physical exertion and/or strain; may require travel, following compliance of all established COVID-19 safety protocols


